On September 14, 2025 Comhaltas Members took part in the Parade of flags; all 32 Counties, 4 Provinces, 2 Countries to the statue of Robert Emmet which stands directly in front of the Academy of Sciences. All then marched back to the bandshell where the Golden Gate Park Band played a selection of Irish music which was interspersed with performances by Comhaltas dancers. 
