In the June Sceal, we endeavored to give you an idea of what a CCE Convention/Festival Weekend was like. This month, we will describe the more practical side...the work involved.

Various committees have been meeting on a weekly basis. Some have been planning workshops while others have been negotiating with hotels to accommodate our visitors. The Cooley-Keegan Branch is responsible for providing bands, workshop leaders, dance teachers, entertainment, meals and a hotel which can provide space for these activities. We are responsible for booking a certain number of guest rooms in the hotel in order to have the use of the workshop and dance areas. This is a huge commitment as we then depend on many visitors and "locals" alike, booking into the hotel for the weekend.

A goal of this weekend is to make it pay for itself and perhaps net a few dollars to help in our continuing programs. As you can imagine, the San Francisco Bay Area is an expensive area to visit, so our task is a daunting one.

Several fund-raisers to aid our branch and help with this Convention/Festival Weekend have been planned. However, the success of these events has yet to be determined.

The 2008 Convention/Festival Committee met after final negotiations were completed with the hotel. We examined all the financial details and came to the conclusion that, at this time, without adequate funds in our treasury, we would not be able to successfully host this weekend in 2008.

While we are disappointed, we are not discouraged. We are determined to proceed with our fund raising events as scheduled (House Party – September 3, 2006; Night at the Plough and Stars – October 28, 2006; and the Emerald Extravaganza – February 17, 2007).

It is our hope that the success of these events will ensure the funds necessary to seek and host the CCE North American Convention/Festival Weekend, perhaps as early as 2009. We have a head start on many phases of it, from the work done this year.

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED. We will continue to hold "Convention Meetings" with our efforts directed towards fund raising. There is much to be done and there is work for all.

# 2006 Midwest Regional Fleadh Cheoil



A report by Sean O'Donnell (a Kevin Mallen music scholarship recipient)

On the weekend of May 11th and 12th I attended the Midwest Fleadh Cheoil in St. Louis. The Midwest Fleadh is one of two traditional Irish music competitions held in the United States each year. The other competition, the Mid-Atlantic Fleadh Cheoil, is held on the East coast in June. The Fleadh consists of solo competitions in all the various traditional Irish instruments, as well as competitions for duets, trios, Ceili Bands and Grupai Cheoil. First and second place winners in each competition qualify to compete in the All-Ireland Fleadh that is held in Ireland at the end of August.

At the Fleadh I had the opportunity to watch a number of competitions including: concertina, accordion (which I also competed in and won first place), fiddle and harp. I saw duets, trios, Grupai Cheoil and Ceili Bands compete as well. It was amazing to see so many kids playing traditional Irish music on so many different instruments. The youth Ceili Bands looked like they were having a blast!

My favorite part of the Fleadh was playing at sessions with other kids in the lobby of the hotel. I met many new friends at these sessions. The biggest and liveliest session was after the last competition, which was the Ceili band competition. The session started at midnight and at its height it had fifty or more kids playing instruments from Bodhran to fiddle to every Irish instrument you could imagine. I left at about 2 a.m. because our plane was leaving early the next day, but I wanted to stay until it ended.

We arrived in St. Louis a day early, so I also had time to do some sightseeing while we were there. I visited some of the historic sites in the downtown area. My favorite was riding the tram to the top of the Gateway Arch. We also enjoyed a steamboat ride on the Mississippi River, and we visited a really cool kid's museum called the City Museum. St. Louis was a really fun city to visit!

I had a great time at the Midwestern Fleadh Cheoil in St. Louis, Missouri. It was a great experience and a lot of fun. I can't wait until the Cooley-Keegan Branch can start a youth ceili band so that we will be able to give the Chicago and St. Louis ceili bands a bit of competition at a future Fleadh!
